

Newsletter Article for Lakeside Lutheran Church Pastor Douglas K. Olson

The Apostle Paul reminds us: "For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience" Romans 8:24-25.

My parents lived their retirement years on a small farm in southern Minnesota. We five adult children had our own homes and families. It was fun to come back for family gatherings with

Mom and Dad on the farm. During summer months we sat on the green lawn under tall shade trees. We talked, sang songs and enjoyed meals together. Our parents were focused on their hopes and dreams for the future. Both believed God was present to unwrap their unseen hopes to surprise them. Our mom and dad were future oriented even in times of little income, career changes, moving the family, illness. They always had hope for themselves and us children as we grew up and left for our new futures and relationships.

In the later years dad's health weakened. He passed away suddenly in my mother's arms. Mom was left alone in the country farmhouse. We were concerned. She told us, "I want to take time to work through my grief. Along the way God will give me new hopes and dreams for what lies ahead." Mom did all of that over a period of time. Also, her friends and neighbors and the members of the church were visitors. Slowly Mother started dreaming about a new and different future for herself. God was present to open doors to a new home in assisted living quarters in a nearby town.

The Lakeside Community Lutheran Church family needs time to grieve the loss of a beloved pastor who served you well until his retirement. Give yourselves room to find new hopes and dreams for the future. God is present as the Good Shepherd to guide you beside still waters, sit in the shade together, walk with you through dark times and into right paths to new hopes for a new future. ADRC MEALS ON WHEELS AT LAKESIDE

Sebrina Naglosky spoke to the council on changes in the way ADRC is handling Meals on Wheels and congregate in-person dining. They are moving from 3 kitchens to 1 in Siren. This development caused the A&H Senior Center to decide not to participate and a new dining area was needed. They will prepare the food in Siren and bring it to Lakeside in bulk to be packaged for home distribution and in-person dining. They will use our plates, silverware, etc., for those using our facility. About 7 or less attend on **Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.** They will need the kitchen and a portion of the fellowship hall between 9:30 and 12:30 and

will clean up after themselves. Should a funeral or some other function conflict, they will make other arrangements. This should begin around July 10th.

Cost and Details:

Meals will be served around 11:00am on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. If you wish to make a reservation, or cancel a reservation, please call 715-349-2154, 24 hours in advance. Menu is subject to change without notice. Bread and milk offered with all meals.

60 Years of Age and Older: \$4-\$6/meal donation.

General Public: \$10 /meal

Treasurer's Report as of June 30, 2023

2023 annual budget = \$271,247

The 2023 budget needs an average of \$22,000 in monthly offerings to be fully funded. With our interim pastor at 2/3 full time this average monthly offering is reduced to \$18,630.

Items that flow through as 'non-budget' include:

Endowment Fund contributions Memorials, Building Fund Reserve, Pastoral Call Reserve and Youth Scholarship funds

The first six months of 2023 ended with Budget Receipts exceeding Budget Expenses by \$1,457.

The two expenses for June in the special funds of \$25 and \$450 were sent to the endowment fund and paid the first installment on the congregational survey "Holy Cow" respectively.

Total receipts for the first six months exceeded total expenses by just \$339.



Hello Lakeside Family,

As you may know, I am the Vice President of the Luther Park Camping and Retreat Center Board of Directors, as well as an almost 20 year past staff member. Luther Park is the Bible Camp that has been connected with Lakeside as a corporate member congregation for many years and how I became a member at Lakeside.

I am reaching out as I need your help. The past half a dozen years or so Luther Park has sponsored a fundraiser concert in the Twin Cities with the band Morpheus. They play very popular songs from the 60's and 70's along with others. This concert is held in the fall each year and for the Morpheus concert this year, we are challenging each corporate church to produce a BIG raffle basket that people can purchase tickets to win. We would like the baskets to be worth \$200-\$500 in value. Camp is asking the board members (that is me) to head up the planning and execution for their own church's basket. The hope is that we as a congregation could get 10 people to buy 10 things (or whatever the number may be) to add and make our Lakeside basket a full, big (& expensive) thing!

I have chosen the theme Family Game Night, which can include Games, Escape room voucher, Snacks, Drinks, anything that you feel would be a great addition to game night. Now this could be a family game night with adolescent children/grandchildren or a family game night with adult children, or we could combine that together. We can let our imaginations go wild. I have already started the collection with the game "Sorry". As you think about the possible contents of our basket (anything fun can be used as our actual basket) think about connections you have in our church and surrounding areas or the Twin Cities. Who do you know that provides a service that could be a good addition to a basket? Who do you know that might like to help you add to our theme? Who do you know that might like to donate an item?

The timeline for this project is to let Leah, Luther Park's Executive Director, know our theme by Friday, July 28th. By Friday, September 1st, Leah would like our basket completed (or close to it!) so that we can work on getting the basket items in one location. At that time, Camp staff and Board members will make sure the baskets are all presentable and will take pictures so that the baskets can be advertised for what people can win. Please share this information with congregation members and let me know if you would like to be a part of this challenge, if you have ideas or items to add. Thanks so much.
